



IMPORTANT: Precautions to take - Lake Tremblant Water Quality

(Lac-Tremblant-Nord, September 8, 2023) - The municipality would like to inform citizens that we were made aware this morning of the possible existence of cyanobacteria on Lake Tremblant. A similar phenomenon was also observed on Lake Bibite.

We continue to monitor both situations very closely.

Following receipt of this information, a report was made to the Ministry of the Environment for an analysis of the situation, and we are awaiting the results for the moment.

In the meantime, as a preventive measure, please consult the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux' recommendations concerning blue-green algae:

We invite you to be as cautious as possible in this type of situation. It is important to follow the recommendations and precautions indicated by the Ministry, in particular not to drink the lake water or go swimming.

PLTN offers drinking water to citizens who need it, the water is available next to the garage door of the guardian's house as well as in the bathroom next to the garage.
