



UPDATE: Precautions to take - Water quality for lakes Bibite and Tremblant

(Lac-Tremblant-Nord, September 22, 2023) - Following the discovery of the possible presence of cyanobacteria in lakes Bibite and Tremblant two weeks ago, we would like to provide citizens with the following updates and information regarding each of the two lakes:

Lake Bibite

Higher levels of cyanobacteria were measured recently and remain visible on Lake Bibite, the situation remains under continued surveillance.

That being said, we continue to invite citizens to be as cautious as possible in this type of situation, as it is important to follow the recommendations and precautions indicated by the government, in particular:

- **Not to drink the water from the lake**
- **Not to swim**
- **Not to use the water directly from the lake for preparing meals or giving it to animals**

Lake Tremblant

Lower levels of cyanobacteria were recently measured on Lake Tremblant, however, it is important to remain vigilant at all times and observe the water before using it for any purpose, to see if any particles or abnormal odours are present.
